








INTRODUCTION



➤ INEP Business Planning Unit is a Section within the Department of Minerals Resources and Energy that comprises of three Directorates namely: IGR, Capital Programme and Technical Planning.









INTRODUCTION

 The purpose of INEP Grant is to electrify households for all the disadvantaged communities in order to eradicate the electrification backlog in the country and reach universal access by 2025.

- Most of Western Cape municipalities that have been allocated INEP Grant and are performing as required.
- Few that underspends pushes National Treasury to institute internal stopping and reallocation process in line with section 19 of the Division of Revenue Act based on consolidated monthly report from municipalities to the DMRE and section 71 reports submitted to Provincial Treasury.












IMPLEMENTATION GUIDELINES

Implementation of INEP is guided by several implementation guidelines to ensure that funded projects eventually fulfills the mandate of the Department.

- SUITE OF SUPPLY (POLICY GUIDELINES) covers all project categories and is the fundamental guideline that highlights minimum technical aspects to be adhered to.
- Bulk Infrastructure guideline deals with requirements for funding of substations and distribution supply lines.
- Informal Settlement guideline deals with steps to follow in sourcing funding for the electrification of informal settlement.
- **3.** Farm Dweller Houses guideline highlights criteria for funding of electrification of farm dweller houses.
- 4. Non-grid Electrification guideline provides guidelines for electrification of houses that are far from electricity infrastructure.
- 5. Mixed Developments and Developer Projects guideline outline the process and requirements for funding the electrification of mixed housing developments and the minimum level of service.
















INEP PLANNING CYCLE

April 2022

Municipalities invited to apply for funding using indicative allocations/backlog

May - July 2022

Initial site verifications and technical assessments done on selected projects

August 2022

Project analysis and verification of outstanding technical information

September 2022

Final site verifications and technical assessments including projects for mid-term review. Regional Pre-allocation meetings. January 2023

Awaiting funding approval from National Treasury

December 2022

Awaiting funding approval from National Treasury

November 2022

Funding recommendations presented at the NEAC and submission to National Treasury for approval

October 2022

Funding recommendations for 2023/24 projects and 2022/23 mid-term review to Allocation Committee February 2023

Allocations gazetted on Division of Revenue Bill

March 2023

Signing of contracts

April 2023

Commencement of 2022/23 project implementation

May 2023

Project implementation continues



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

Monthly progress reports (Annexure C) should be submitted to the Regional Office I supporting documents (proof payment) for the expenditure reported;

Monthly reports should be signed off by the Municipal Manager / delegated official.

15th of June, Sept and Dec (Due date for cash flow requests)

Cash Flow Requests / Annexure D's should be submitted to DMRE Regional office;

15th of July, Oct, and Feb

The transfers are effected by Finance to municipalities.

Due dates for quarterly performance reports

■ 12 Nov 2022 (1st Quarter), 12 Feb 2023 (2nd Quarter), 12 May 2023 (3rd Quarter) 2023 and 12 Aug 2023 (4th Quarter).

31st of August 2023 (Due date for DoRA evaluation reports)










CHALLENGES


- Funding available lesser than demand
- Non submission or late submission of monthly and quarterly reports.
- Reporting of non-contracted projects (project change control required).
- Expenditure reported without supporting documents.
- Reports not signed by the Municipal Manager.
- Cash flow not requested according to the approved payment schedule.
- Projects applied for rollovers not in line with what has been reported to the Department.
- Late appointment of consultants and contractors which delays the implementation of projects (supply chain delays). This leads to under expenditure, which leads to the stopping of allocation and rollovers, if not approved leads to recoupments by NT.
- Demanding of stake from INEP project funds by dev. Forums and local labour




