ECB Mandate

- Derived from the Electricity Act no 4, of 2007, Section 3 sub section (1)
 - to exercise control over and regulate the provision, use and consumption of electricity in Namibia.
 - to oversee the efficient functioning and development of the electricity industry and security of electricity provision.
 - to ensure the efficient provision of electricity
 - to ensure a competitive environment in the electricity industry in Namibia with such restrictions as may be necessary for the security of electricity provision and other public interest
 - to promote private sector investment in the electricity industry in accordance with prevailing Government Policies
- Mandate to be expanded after transition from ECB to Namibia Energy Regulatory Authority (NERA) after promulgation of the NERA Bill

IMPLEMENTATION OF REGULATORY INSTRUMENTS



- Approved Rules 2021/22 Ongoing promulgation
 - > Rules on the Redistribution and Resale of Electricity
 - > MSB Rules
 - > Electricity Storage Rules
 - > Reviewed Safety Code
- Approved Standards: Adopted and published in April 2021. Readily available for purchase from NSI
 - Low Voltage Electrical Installation Wiring Standards (LVEIWS)
 - > Distribution Infrastructure Standards (DIS)
 - > Quality of Supply Standards (QoSS)
 - > Quality of Service Standards (QoSS)

REVIEWING SOME KEY REGULATORY INSTRUMENTS



- Transmission Grid Code
 - Currently under review

Technical Rules

- Currently under review
- Key stakeholders' engagement completed on 3rd of March 2023
- Stakeholder workshop scheduled for 23 March 2023

ESI Performance Framework

- Currently under review
- Framework to monitor licensees' performance
- > To be published annually in ECB annual report
- > Outcome to be shared and discussed with stakeholders

Net Metering Rules

- Currently under review
- Stakeholder workshop planned for April 2023

Distribution Code Review

> Under 2023/24 FY

DEVELOPMENT OF REGULATORY INSTRUMENTS



- Development of Embedded Generation Standards currently on going
 - > Workshop scheduled 24 March 2023
 - Final draft standards document approval by ECB Boards: end June 2023
 - > Submit to MME for NSI adoption and publishing.
- Electric Vehicles (EVs) Charging Stations Standards
 - > Under 2023/24 FY

COMPLIANCE WITH LICENSE CONDITIONS



Technical Compliance Audits

- ECB's annual compliance audits and follow-up compliance audits will be conducted from May until Nov 2023 for the 2023/2024 FY
- > Objective of audits is to establish the extent to which audited facilities comply with the stipulated license conditions, codes, standards and regulations
- Outcome of audits is used to compile the annual Namibia National Electricity Infrastructure Report
- Maintenance works carried out will be verified during audits if they correspond to what was indicated in the approved tariffs/ORM
- Licensees' procedures for engaging stakeholders when constructing lines on Private and Communal Property will be checked as per the letters issued in August 2022
- Licensees' procedures for climbing line poles will also be checked as per the letters issued in August 2022

Economic/Financial Compliance

> ORM financial report for annual tariff adjustment



ESI RESTRUCTURING

Establishment of the Central RED

- Initial phase of stakeholder consultations concluded
- Stakeholder consultations are on-going
- Stakeholder workshop took place on 8 December 2022 to consult on the recommendation
- Recommendation:
 - To consider City of Windhoek (with NamPower surrounding distribution Central) as a distributor on its own
 - □ To consider Okahandja and the whole of Omaheke Region joining CENORED
- Report shared with the Board and submitted to the Minister

Establishment of the Southern RED

- Awaits the approval of SORED Agreements from AG's office
- Distribution situation in the south of the country is getting worse
- The ECB appointed a seasoned consultant to assist in the operationalisation of SORED
- The ECB and consultant to engage stakeholders affected
- Involves consulting stakeholders affected
- REDs to assisting local authorities outside existing RED areas



ESI RESTRUCTURING CONT...

Solar PV Rooftop rental / lease agreements

- Increased in number of service providers that offer equipment rental/lease agreements for PV rooftop systems
- Pure rental or rent-to-own agreement
- Regarded as selling electricity
- Stakeholder consultation meeting held on 1 July 2022
- Resolved to make a ruling that is fair to all parties concerned, not stifling innovation in the ESI
- ECB consider an exemption from licensing requirement with conditions to be issued
- Proposed Ruling notice issued during November 2022
- ECB received inputs on the ruling from stakeholders
- Workshop planned for April 2023
- ECB to make a ruling after conducting a Regulatory Impact Assessment.



ESI RESTRUCTURING CONT...

Token Identifier (TID) Rollover

- On 24 November 2024, all prepaid meters based on Standard Transfer Specifications (STS) technology will stop dispensing electricity
- TID rollover event information available on <u>www.tidrollover.com</u>
- Letters sent out on 13 September 2022 requesting licensees to share their readiness plans
- Very few licensees shared their implementation plans; most have not
- National stakeholders' awareness workshop planned for April 2023.



CONCLUSION

- TID rollover to be taken seriously as the clock is ticking
- Innovations don't have to be major developments in technology or new business models
 - Small steps yielding to great results
 - Enhances easy regulation
 - Can be achieved through ESI collaboration
